- Principal's Message: Mary Nichols
- Presentation:
 - Transition to Plan B
 - Plan B Team, researching other schools, leadership team that meets weekly, meetings with central office, numerous surveys, HR/Medical Considerations, Final Survey (2/21)
 - Grade Level Teams, Class Lists/Adjustments (teachers met on the weekend to do this), Blue/Green weeks by 2/26, communications, training for COVID safety (2), Behavior Support Training, Basic Procedures Planning, Social Emotional Curriculum Resources Training for staff, grounds work!
 - Hybrid Plans by Grade Level:
 - K: 3 in person and 1 virtual teacher (40 doing virtual everyday)
 - There will be 2 30-minute math groups and then will meet with AIs for smaller groups. Reading and fundations will be in small group.
 - 1st: created teams: one teacher in person and one virtual.
 - 2nd: created teams: one teacher in person and one virtual.
 - 3rd: 17 kids in an in-person class (lots returning, this is more than), Ms. Hunt & Ms. Hency will be in-person teachers + 3rd grade teachers,
 - 4th: 3 in person and 1 virtual teacher
 - 5th: each teacher will do V + in-person

- Virtual Learning
 - 100% Virtual
 - Small groups
 - Morning Meeting
 - Dedicated support
 - Remote-Hybrid
 - Small groups
 - Flexibility and aligned with in-person
- Implementation
 - More outside learning and eating spaces
 - Arrival and dismissal procedures
 - Teaching students about safety
 - Helping with the transition
 - Making sure prioritize clear communication

- Making sure virtual learning remains important/prioritized
- Aligning our instruction virtual and in person
- Realizing that his is for ¼ of our school year helping to keep it in perspective
- We will continue to evolve and make it work
- Class sizes are smaller so almost all classes will have teacher assistants
- Transition day is a way to say goodbye to this class and meeting your new teacher. Kindergarten is on 3/5, 3-5th grade will be 3/15-18.
- Virtual weeks will have more academics than currently. Teaching through with the same lesson plans for in-person and virtual.
- Everything ends at 130 for virtual or in-person.

- Majority of staff have had their vaccine (at least the 1st shot).
 - Teachers are given the time to go and get the vaccine and coverage will be provided.

 - New tier plans, to get students back on track academically
 - Show the announcements in our meetings

- Treasurer's Report: Ashley Israel, Sara Niedenthal, and Dawn Rollins
- The picnic table donations were awesome and so quick!
- Got another corporate contribution for \$500, from French Broad Pediatrics

- Drum Building Project for 5th Graders
 - This was not budgeted originally

- Using unused money from the Social Justice team (the funds were set aside for substitutes for planning days, but teachers weren't/aren't able to do this because of the current circumstances), the PTO would support funding \$3,900 the 5th grade Drum Project and Brooks will be getting donations/fundraising for the remaining \$1,100 balance.
- Teacher Mini Grants: Gabrielle Trott
 - o \$2,1958 has been pledged
 - Ms Kickert has not used her grant money yet. She is waiting until we are back in session.
 - New applications: All three approved
 - \$300 for 3rd grader Specialist integrated workshop in person artists. Mr. Bartin who is an African American artist. Workshop in person with William Conwell is a Celtic artist/musician (4th graders).
 - \$130 for the entire 4th grade in person students. Dry erase markers.
 - \$200 for 4 baskets of sensory bins: fidget toys etc and items to give kids.
- SJL Parent Auxiliary: Amy Aiken
 - Presentation from last week
 - o 30 registered and about 25 attended
 - Need to figure out how to share the recording
 - This month YWCA, inviting all caretakers to participate in the 21-day challenge. Some videos, prompts, questions, to get you thinking.
